Halloween Safety Tips

COSTUMES

- Costumes should not restrict movement or vision
- Opt for brightly coloured costumes
- Wear reflective tape and use glowsticks to increase visibility
- Use flame resistant accessories and costumes
- Use face paints instead of masks
- If your costume includes weapons make sure they look fake
- Dress for the weather when you are out there getting candies
- Avoid coloured contact lenses



HOUSE RULES

- Only go to houses that are lit



TRICK OR TREATING

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

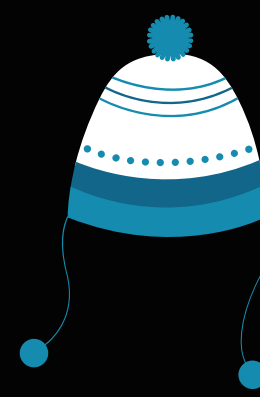

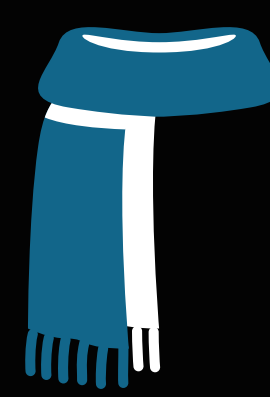

Staying home when sick helps keep our entire school community healthy including teachers, admin staff and students. **Please do your part and stay home when sick.**

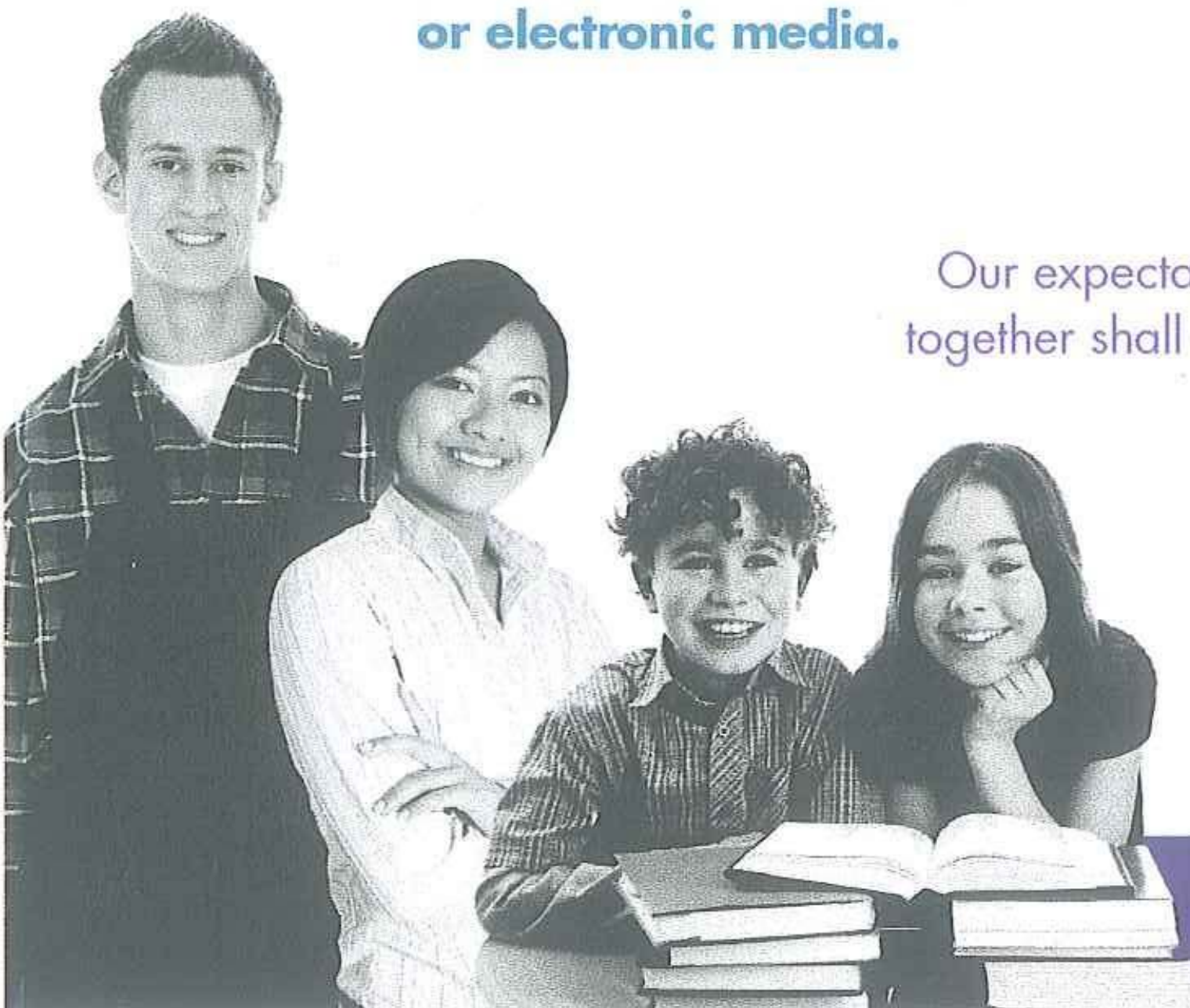


HOW WE LEARN AND WORK TOGETHER
