May 5	Cultural	Dutch Heritage Day Created in recognition of the sacrifices made by Canadians in the liberation of the Netherlands, as well as the contributions made to Canada by those of Dutch heritage.
May 5	Anti- Oppression Indigenous	Red Dress Day A day to raise awareness about missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls.
May 10	Anti- Oppression Indigenous	Bear Witness Day The Anniversary of the Canadian Human Rights Tribunal first non-compliance order called for Canada to fully implement Jordan's Principle by May 10, 2016. Jordan's Principle ensures First Nations children receive the services and supports they need when they need them.
May 12	Faith-based Buddhism	Wesak and Buddha Day A significant Buddhist holiday that commemorates the birth, enlightenment, and death of Buddha.
May 17	2SLGBTQ+	International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia, and Biphobia A day to recognize the courage and resilience of 2SLGBTQ+ activists of the past and present who have fought for equity and against discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.
May 18-24	Anti-racism	Anti-racism Awareness Week

May 21	Anti-racism	World Day for Cultural Diversity for DialogueDevelopmentA United Nations day that helps communitiesunderstand the value of cultural diversity and learn howto live together in harmony.
May 23	Anti-racism	Anniversary of Komagata Maru On May 23, 1914, the Komagata Maru steamship arrived in Vancouver's Burrard Inlet. On board were 376 Sikhs, Muslims, and Hindus of South Asian origin and were denied entry into Canada based on racist laws.
May 25-31	Anti- oppression Ability	National Accessibility WeekFounded in 1988 and inspired by Rick Hansen's Man InMotion World Tour, this week is an opportunity tocelebrate Canadians with disabilities and raiseawareness of the critical need for accessibility andinclusion for all in our communities and workplaces.
